On 5 September 2023, Associate Professor Rico Ihle presented the achievements made by the e-AgriMBA project since its start in September 2022 to Her Excellency Maia Sandu, President of the Republic of Moldova. e-AgriMBA platform training for lecturers and students in Mad, Hungary in October 2023

The Faculty of Economics of the University of Debrecen hosted a workshop for instructors of international agricultural economics trainings in Mad. The two-day event was attended by representatives of seven e-AgriMBA consortium countries in person and online. Krisztián Kovács and Ádám Péntek

presented the electronic platform developed as part of the project to 22 future AgriMBA instructors. The University of Debrecen together with the University of Zagreb are responsible for developing and testing a common and unified online e-learning system for the educational institutions of the whole AgriMBA network, the so-called AgriMBA Learning System. In addition to online lecturing, all training materials are shared via this online system including books, articles, and videos.

The e-platform helps the international AgriMBA universities to jointly manage the courses they provide to the network, to jointly develop and share courses and teaching materials with each other, in the spirit of lifelong learning. The system is already in use for the running AgriMBA programmes including the new one at TUM Moldova.

Study trip to Brussels

AgriMBA network students and staff visit EU institutions in Brussels, Belgium

Between November 27th and December 1st, 2023, a mixed group of AgriMBA students and staff of TUM in Moldova and SGGW in Poland made a study visit to Brussels - the famous European affairs capital. Participants had the opportunity to interact with representatives of European institutions, international organizations as well as representation of the Belgian agricultural industry.

Brussels visit destinations were:

- General Directorate for Agriculture and Rural Development of the European Commission (DG Agri)
- Permanent Representation of Romania to the European Union.
- COPA-COGECA, representing the largest umbrella organizations for farmers and agricultural cooperatives in Europe, as well as the most influential agricultural lobby group in the EU.
- FOODDRINKSEUROPE, the voice of the food industry in the European Union.
- European Parliament, meeting with the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development representative and the House of European History.

The AgriMBA group also had the opportunity to visit agri-cooperatives such as Bel'Export, BelOrta and New Green, with a cumulative turnover of over 450 million euros annually. As part of the Belgian experience, they visited a family owned agricultural company-Forward Farm, which specializes e.g. in growing potatoes in rotation. It serves as a demonstration farm and research partner for Bayer CropScience.

The participants had a unique opportunity to familiarize with the legislative process at the European level and how farmers' best interests are taken into account in this complex process. The

legislative process involves several European institutions, which are consulted by civil society organizations, while multi-layered negotiations can extend the process by 2-3 years.

e-AgriMBA at 2023 EAAE

Organized session on "Digitalization of agribusiness education" at the 2023 Congress of European Association of Agricultural Economists in Rennes - organized by the e-AgriMBA project

This organized session was designed to showcase innovative practices in digitalization of agribusiness education from across Europe and various academic and non-academic stakeholders.

The session put a spotlight on inspiring practices in agribusiness management and rural development and provided a condensed overview of approaches and ideas to reduce the digital divide between urban and rural regions across the EU by promoting inclusiveness and green practices. The session was chaired by AgriMBA network scientists: Bruce Ahrendsen (University of Arkansas - USA) and Rico Ihle (Wageningen University - The Netherlands). Whereas the session discussants were Cornelis Gardebroek (Wageningen University – The Netherlands) and Wim Heijman (Czech University of Life Sciences – Czechia).

1st presentation: How Vocational Education and Training can Drive the Green Transition in Agri-food by Stelina Chatzichristou (Expert, European Center for the Development of Vocational Training -Cedefop). 2nd presentation: *Digitization of Higher* Education: Realities and Perspectives in the EU Accession Candidate Moldova by Andrei Bragarenco and Dinu Turcanu (Technical University of Moldova). 3rd presentation: Innovative Solutions and Methods in Professional Agribusiness Education in Europe - the Example of e-AgriMBA Learning System by Agata Malak Rawlikowska - Warsaw University of Life Sciences (Poland) and co-authors from the e-AgriMBA project team: Katarzyna Kurek and Wim Heijman (CULS - Czechia), Krisztián Kovacs (UNIDEB - Hungary), Peter Bielik (SAUN - Slovakia), Josip Juračak (UNIZAG - Croatia), Aurelia Litvin (TUM - Moldova), Rico Ihle (WU - The Netherlands).

4th presentation: *Creative Learning for Boosting Bioeconomy within HEIs' Curricula* by Nina Drejerska (Warsaw University of Life Sciences - Poland) and co-authors from the CL4BIO project Team: Pamela Burnard (United Kingdom), Mariantonietta Fiore (Italy), Demetris Vrontis (Cyprus), Valentina Chkoniya (Portugal), Wioleta Sobczak (Poland).

This special session concluded with a series comments from the discussants - Cornelis Gardebroek and Wim Heijman. A discussion of panellists and the public followed up with a simulative exchange of experiences and perceptions on how to promote new ideas and initiatives in life-long learning in agribusiness. This organized session aimed to contribute to a broad discourse on achieving the EU's Digital Decade, the EU Digital Strategy as well as the goals of the European Education Area and the OECD's Innovation Strategy for Education and Training.
