# Wageningen agricultural technicians in the labour market (situation in 2022)


Wageningen University & Research has been conducting labour market surveys among its alumni since 1973. Employment data collected from graduates of the Master's programme in Biosystems Engineering (MBE) are presented below. Previous surveys (from 1973 onwards) are also included.

Alumni are divided into three groups:

- 1 Graduated between 2016 and 2019 ( graduated less than 5 years ago)
- 2 Graduated between 2005 and 2016 ( graduated between 5 and 15 years ago)
- 3 Graduated between 1980 and 2005 ( graduated more than 15 years ago)



### Sectors in which MBE alumni work




### Positions held by MBE alumni

Recent graduates often have different jobs to those who graduated some time ago. For example, recent MBE graduates are more likely to work as technologists or technical specialists. MBE alumni who have been in employment longer are more likely to be advisors.



### Organisations in which MBE alumni work

Recent graduates often work in different organisations to those who graduated some time ago. For example, recent MBE graduates are more likely to work in agriculture and horticulture organisations, while those who have been in employment longer are more likely to have jobs at engineering and consultancy firms.
