- 2 Graduated between 2005 and 2016 (graduated between 5 and 15 years ago)






Sectors in which MBI alumni work




Positions held by MBI alumni

Recent graduates often have different jobs to those who graduated some time ago. For example, recent MBI graduates are more likely to work as researchers or teachers/trainers. MBI alumni who have been in employment longer are more likely to be advisors.



Organisations in which MBI alumni work

Recent graduates often work in different organisations to those who graduated some time ago. For example, recent MBI graduates are more likely to work at engineering and consultancy firms, while those who have been in employment longer are more likely to have jobs at a university or other educational institution.
