

Employment data collected from graduates of the Master's programme in Management, Economics and Consumer Studies (MME) are presented below. Previous surveys (from 1973 onwards) are also included. Alumni are divided into three groups:

- 1 Graduated between 2016 and 2019 (• graduated less than 5 years ago)
- 2 Graduated between 2005 and 2016 (• graduated between 5 and 15 years ago)
- 3 Graduated between 1980 and 2005 (• graduated more than 15 years ago)








Positions held by MME alumni

Organisations in which MME alumni work

Recent graduates often work in different organisations to those who graduated some time ago. For example, recent MME graduates are more likely to work in the food and animal feed industries, while those who have been in employment longer are more likely to have jobs in agriculture and horticulture or in other industries.
