Employment data collected from graduates of the Master's programme in Tourism, Society and Environment (MTO) are presented below. Previous surveys (from 1973 onwards) are also included. (Source: Career Monitor 2022. English summary on pages 5 and 6)

Alumni are divided into three groups:

- 1 Graduated between 2016 and 2019 (graduated less than 5 years ago)
- 2 Graduated between 2005 and 2016 (graduated between 5 and 15 years ago)
- 3 Graduated between 1980 and 2005 (graduated more than 15 years ago)





Sectors in which MTO alumni work











Positions held by MTO alumni

Recent graduates often have different jobs to those who graduated some time ago. For example, recent MTO graduates are more likely to work as researchers, policy officers or advisors. MTO alumni who have been in employment longer are more likely to be advisors.



Organisations in which MTO alumni work

Recent graduates often work in different organisations to those who graduated some time ago. For example, recent MTO graduates are more likely to work at research institutions and organisations in forest and nature management, recreation, culture, sports. Those who have been in employment longer are more likely to work at local government agencies.
