The WIAS Science Day 2024 with the theme "ANIMALS IN A CHANGING WORLD" was a great success. It was a day full of inspiring oral presentations of 31(!) PhD candidates and one EngD candidate divided over two parallel sessions "Animal behaviour and biology" and "Animal physiology and genetics". The sessions were chaired by enthusiastic WIAS PhD candidates, postdocs and staff members, ensuring lively discussions with each presenter. During lunch there was a poster session with posters of 18 WIAS PhD candidates showing plans and first results of, mostly, recently started PhD candidates.

The day was opened with a keynote by Prof. Dr Liesbeth Sterck, professor in Ecological determinants of behaviour at Utrecht University, who gave us insights on primate social behavior and what we can learn from them. At the end of the day, Prof. Bas Haring, professor in Public Understanding of Science at the University of Leiden gave an interactive lecture and discussed animals, ethics and society with the audience.

The best oral presentation prize was awarded to Gibbs Kuguru (ABG) for his presentation entitled "Genomic Data Reveals Extremely Low Genetic Diversity and Inbreeding Risk in Maldivian Blacktip Reef Sharks (Carcharhinus melanopterus)". The best poster prize was awarded to Elke Molenaar for her poster on "Handling Heat - Disentangling avian responses to temperature". Congratulations!

Updated Procedure for Booking Doctoral Defence Ceremony Dates

A new and improved procedure regarding the booking of doctoral defence ceremony dates will be effective from July 2024. This change will eliminate the need for the stressful event of having to book a date at the first working day of the month and the disappointment which in certain cases originated from it. From July 2024 onwards, booking a ceremony date will be possible after the approval of:

- 1. the draft thesis manuscript;
- 2. the thesis committee.

This means that in order to secure a slot, both criteria must be met.

There will be 15-week period between the time you are able to book a doctoral defence ceremony date and the first available slot. This means that only promotion slots meeting this requirement will be available in the Hora Finita ceremony calendar. Please note that this timeline is specific to the PhD trajectory and the term for which slots can be booked will change every day. The envisaged changes will be implemented to address the challenges encountered with the current procedure and to streamline the booking process, ultimately aimed at providing a more organized and less stressful experience for all involved parties

WGS Sandwich PhD Programme

The aim of the WGS Sandwich PhD Programme is capacity building: a way for the university to reach out to like-minded scientific institutes to build international scientific networks, to facilitate exchange and to reinforce the knowledge basis of these institutes. The grant of the WGS sandwich PhD programme covers living allowance (salary costs via a fictitious employment agreement) for a total of 18 months in Wageningen, (partial) travel costs of candidate and WU/local supervisors, visa application costs, WUR account and use of facilities.

Additional funding for a candidate is needed for the time not spent in Wageningen. The education budget and the costs for printing the thesis are not included in the budget. The WU chair group at which candidates conduct their research are expected to pay these costs.
